

Part 2: Dictionarv Conundrum

Only common words! Always hit enter! Only dictionarv search, no quacksaurus! Carry the dictionarv with you! If there isn't a common word result, ignore the instruction! Always use absolute value like real mathematicians! Finally, remember that spaces are characters too!

1. Gather the following supplies: 6 people, six seats around a table with sliders, onelook.com and a sulking dictionay.
2. Number the chairs in clockwise order, starting with number one moving to number six
3. Have each player sit in one of the chairs, number themselves according to the number of their chair plus one and pull out their sliders.
4. Place and/or drag the sulking dictionay into the lap of player 5. If it complains, read it a few definitions and it should calm down.
5. Push in every slider that has a prime player sitting at it.
6. Move the book counter-clockwise to the next player with a slider out, that player picks the second word from D??K???
7. Assign the rest of the players words placing the nth letter of the player with the dictionay's word at the end of a word to make a word of total length $n+1$, where n is the number of that player's seat. Take the $(2*n)$ th result.
8. Any player whose word can be made from the letters of the other players' words stands. All the standing players swap seats and sit in clockwise order.
9. All Players swap the orientation of their sliders except for the player with the dictionay. That player spends the time giving the dictionay to the player they walked past halfway through their last movement.
10. Now take the first letter of each player's word and apply a caeser shift of $3*n$ to that letter where n is the indexed position of the first letter that is not in alphabetical order in the word or, if no such letter exists, the length of the word. Remove all other letters besides the shifted one, maintain length except if you have the dictionay (that player should shorten their word by 1) and take the n^2 th result.
11. Give the dictionay to the player with a non-letter in their word.
12. All players without the dictionay swap seats in order alphabetically according to the nth letter of their word where n is 1 if the slider is in and 2 if the slider is out. Start with the dictionay holding player and arrange clockwise.
13. Give the player whose is sitting in the chair with number that is $1/2$ their number the dictionay. The player who has the greatest difference between their seat and number changes their slider. The player in the seat equal to that difference also changes their slider. The player who has the dictionay sits in that player's lap, falls asleep and should not be awakened and cannot follow the instructions.
14. Each player adds n letters to the end of their word and takes the first result where n is the number of chairs they have sat in thus far.
15. The players whose words did not just change swap seats and words.
16. All this moving woke up the dictionay player. Confused as to why people played while they were gone, they delete their word and take the nth player's word where n is least difference between a player's number and that player's seat number.
17. The dictionay looks at his new player's word, finds it disgusting and runs clockwise to another player, finding the same gross word, it runs the same length and sits in that player's lap.

18. The players find the first new word, preserving length and the $(n+1)$ th and the last letter, where n is the number of sliders out at their seat plus the number of ductionaries in their lap.
19. The players, ever fickle, find another new word, this time preserving length, the first letter and the n th letter where n is the number of the seat they are sitting in. Before searching for the first word, swap the positions of the saved letters unless they are the same letter.
20. These barely seem like words anymore. Might as well make them jibberish right? Caesar shift the time period by 0, the city by 5, the fish by 19 but only after making it plural, the smallest object by 2, the country by 4 and the surgery by 1. Select the (n) th letter of the player's word, where n is the highest number chair that player sat in.
