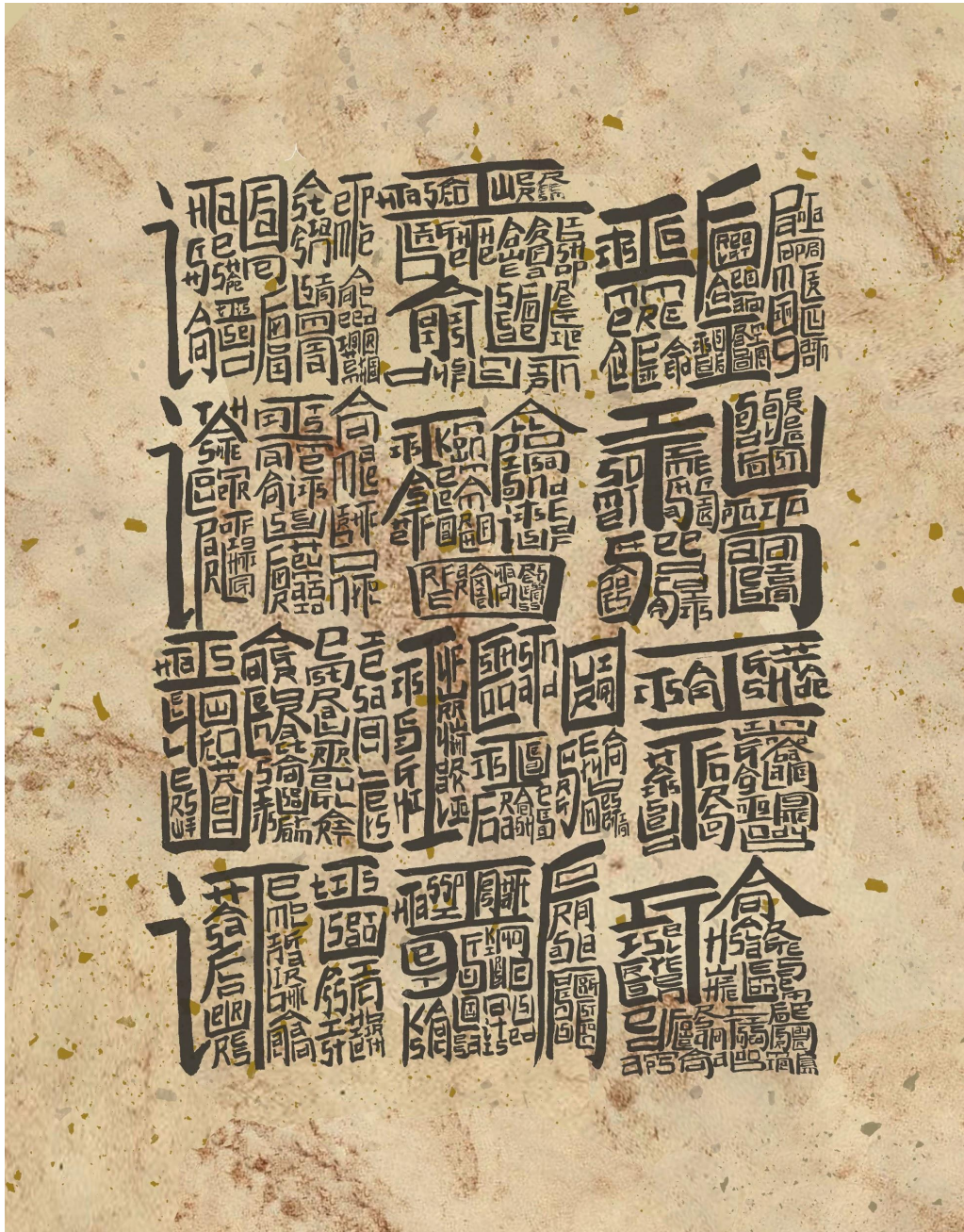
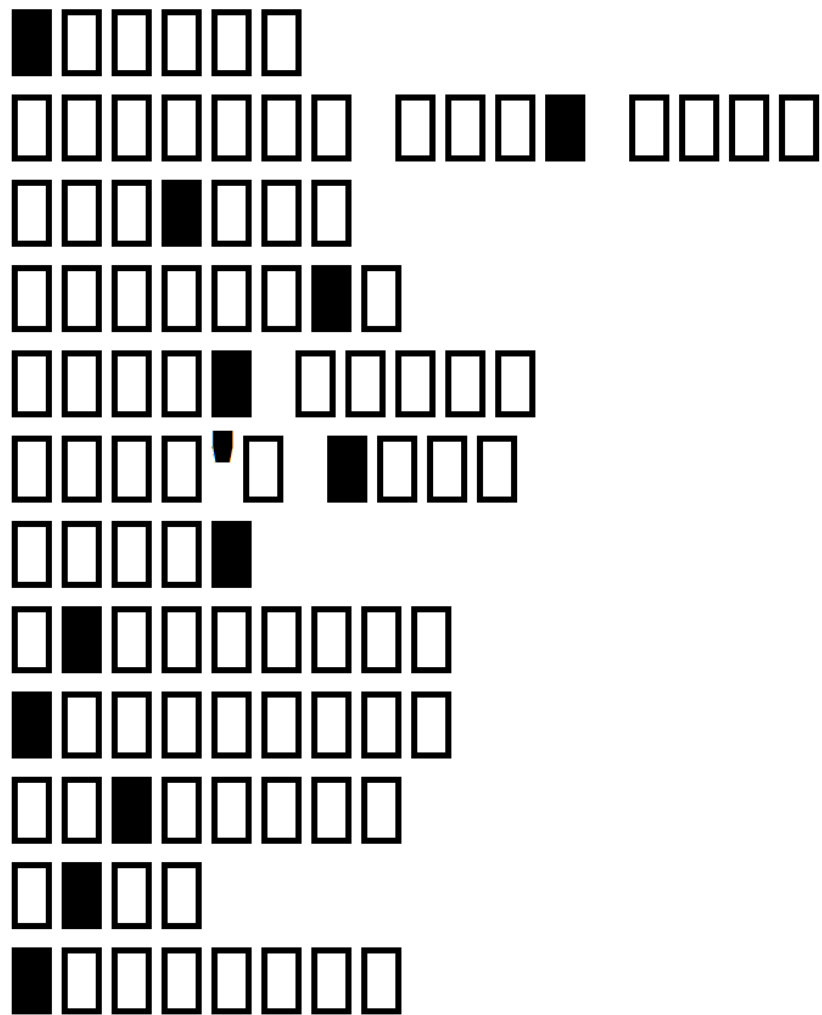
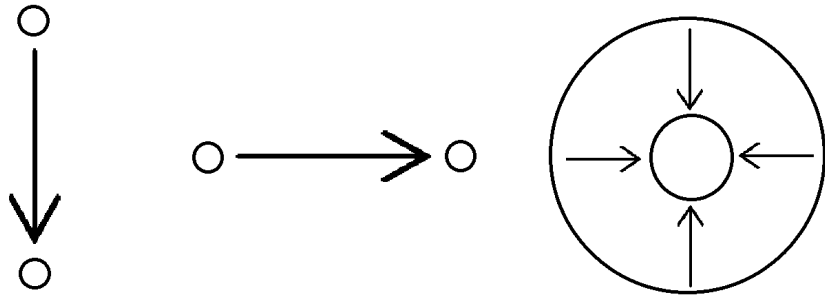


Calligraphic Cures

SOLUTION

Each “character,” though appearing as Chinese calligraphy, is, in fact, an English sentence. The general sequence for reading the letters is from top to down, left to right, outside to inside, which was clued in the top graphs on the second page.

In the same sequence of top to down, left to right, the English sentences are:

It has the shape of an east Asian temple and it is used for boils insomnia and bleeding hemorrhoids

It has the counterpart of lightning in its name and it is used for rheumatoid arthritis and male birth control

It has yellow flowers with red and green bracts and it is used for menstrual irregularities and ulcers

It has a flower resembling a birth canal and it is used to assist in childbirth

It has a flower resembling the headwear of a bishop and it is used for erectile dysfunction

It is known as the female monarch of all poisons and it is used for fear anxiety and restlessness

It is slightly furry with dark violet shoots and it is used for anesthesia during surgery and bone setting

It has spines that get stuck in your socks and clothes and it is used for nasal and sinus congestion

It is commercially cultivated for vegetable oil and it is used for abdominal pain and promoting circulation

It sometimes has tick shaped seeds and it is used for severe constipation and lesions

It is a nightshade that is used for slowing aging and balancing the body

It is evergreen and has large white lemon scented flowers and it is used for menstrual cramps and abdominal pain
